



LIST OF CRIMEAN JUDGES WHO UNLAWFULLY MAKE JUDGEMENTS ON DEPRIVING CITIZENS OF UKRAINE OF LIBERTY WITHIN A POLITICALLY REASONED CRIMINAL OR ADMINISTRATIVE PROSECUTION

The list includes judges who passed judgements on depriving citizens of Ukraine of liberty contrary to the right on a fair trial and an effective remedy, with a clear fabrication of evidence and/ or using other unlawful investigation means including torturing. Awarding judgements on deprivation of liberty was caused by political reasons and prejudicial treatment of citizens of Ukraine by judges due to their political or religious beliefs or due their exercising the right on freedom of expression and freedom of peaceful assemblies and associations.

CASE OF 26TH FEBRUARY
